St. KURIAKOSE ELIAS CHAVARA

[OUR FOUNDER]

(1805 - 1871)

"Chavarayachan" as he is popularly known, was born at Kainakary in Kerala. He was a great visionary and a saintly priest who ventured into many humanitarian activities in his lifetime. He is the forerunner in the field of Education in Kerala and he is also the Founder of CMI Congregation in India.



He was a great social reformer who started a Sanskrit School for the low caste people and set up an old age home, an orphanage and many other social oriented projects for the people.

Foreseeing the role of Communication Media; he established a printing press at Mannanam. He was a great orator and administrator. He was appointed as the Vicar General of the Syro-Malabar Church, at a time when it had no Bishop of its own.

His commitment in protecting Catholic faith is well known. Above all, he was a great saint who lived a life of prayer and commitment to the society.

It is from his life and his revolutionary reforms we draw the inspiration to carry on the task of imparting wisdom to the generations to come.

LIFE AND LEGACY OF ST. KURIAKOSE ELIAS CHAVARA

- 1. Chavara was born in Kainakary Kerala on 10-2-1805
- 2. Chavara was baptized at Chenamkary parish church on 18-2 1805
- Chavara was dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary as her servant at Vechoor Church on 8-9-1805
- 4. Chavara started his primary education at Kainakary in **1810**
- 5. Chavara joined the parish seminary at Pallipuram in 1818
- 6. Chavara was ordained priest at Arthunkal church on **29-11-1829**
- With Fr. Thomas Palackal and Fr. Thomas Porukara, Chavara founded the First Indian Religious Congregation for Men [CMI] 11-5-1831
- 8. Chavara popularized the Sunday Homilies and introduced Retreats for priests and laity in the Kerala Church since-**1831**
- Chavara established the First Syro Malabar common seminary at Mananam in 1833
- 10. The devotional practice of the 'Way of the Cross' was started at Mannanam from **1838**
- 11. Chavara was appointed as Malpan [Tutor of sacred subjects] and examiner of candidates for priesthood and was authorized to give patents to the newly ordained to hear confessions and to preach in the Churches 16-2-1844
- 12. Chavara founded the first press and publishing house of Syro Malabar Church at Mananam **3-7-1846**
- 13. Chavara founded the First Catholic Sanskrit School in Kerala at Mananam **1846**
- 14. Chavara started the First Syro-Malabar Catechumenate for faith formation at Mananam **1853**
- 15. Chavara is the first professsed religious priest in the Indian Church **8-12-1855**
- 16. Chavara wrote 10 Eclogues [Shepherd's Plays] and introduced them in the CMI novitiate at Koonammavu **1857-1858**
- 17. Chavara was the first appointed vicar general in the Syro-Malabar Church after the time of Archdeacons **8-6-1861**

- 18. Chavara took the leadership in protecting the Syro-Malabar Church from the schismatic intruder bishop Roccos **1861**
- 19. Chavara is the author of the First Malayalam Narrative poem *Anasthasyaude Rakthasakshyam,* an inspirational Martyr's story **1862**
- 20. Chavara edited the Divine Office for priests. Compiled and composed Liturgical Rubrics, liturgical calendar, set the Office of the dead etc., for the Malabar Church **1862-1869**
- 21. Chavara popularized the new 'May month devotion of Blessed Virgin Mary' from Mananam-1864
- 22. Chavara as Vicar General implemented the idea ' A school for A Church' in the Kerala Church **1864**
- 23.In collaboration with Fr. Leopold OCD, an Italian Missionary, Chavara founded the Indian Religious Congregation for Women now known as [CMC] at Koonammavu in Kerala 13-2-1866
- 24. Chavara started the 40 Hours Eucharistic Adoration in Kerala at Koonammavu **15-2-1866**
- 25. Chavara and Fr. Leopold OCD started the first boarding house and school for girls in Kerala at Koonammavu **2-1-1868**
- 26. Chavara prepared the first Instruction manual' A Testament of a Good Father' for the Christian families, first of its kind in the church 13-2-1868
- 27. Chavara founded the first lay charitable organization. the 'Confraternity of St. Joseph for a Happy Death' at Kainakary-1869
- 28. Chavara founded the first Home of Charity-*Upavisala* for the sick, old and Destitute at Kainakary **1869**
- 29. Chavara initiated the Catholic re-union movement of the 19th Century-**1869**
- 30. Chavara died at St. Philomina's Monastery at Koonammavu on **3-1-1871**
- 31. Sanction from Rome to start Chavara's canonization process **9-12-1955**
- 32.Chavara was declared Venerable by Pope John Paul II in Rome on **7-4-1984**

CARMEL SCHOOL

a. Management

The school is under the management of the CMI (Carmelites of Mary Immaculate Fathers of the Preshitha Province, Coimbatore. The Congregation was founded in 1831 at Mannanam near Kottayam and the first and foremost among the indigenous religious congregations in India Blessed Kuriakose Elias Chavara, the founder, gave a definite religious form to this community, He laid the foundation for all the modern and progressive fields of activities to which the congregation is committed at colleges, schools, training and technical institutes all over India. It is also involved in many other social and humanitarian activities.

b. A Brief History of School

The school was established in the year 1983. Due to the earnest request and demand of the people, Rev. Fr. Calistus Maliakal CMI took the initiative to start an English Medium School, thus to give better education to the children of the locality. This unaided school is affiliated to CBSE (No. 930385 Year 2002) upto the secondary level and is directed by the Little Flower Education Society, Coimbatore, which is duly a registered one.

c. The CMI Vision of Education

The students of today are exposed to radical changes in outlook and lifestyle. They enjoy the conveniences of post-modernism, and are vested with power and knowledge. But they are not yet capable of ordering or prioritizing what they have learned and also they lack religious and moral points of reference.

Hence our schools and other educational institutions vigorously pursue the goal of the all-round benefit of the students and of the society at large. Library: Our school is proud of having a very spacious and well furnished library that has got a vast volume of student materials, including encyclopaedia.

Kids Library: A new kids library with computers is set for the initial exploration of the literary and electronic world for the students.

Computer Lab: There are two computer labs. Computer labs are equipped with the latest machines and softwares. They enable the students to be efficient and effective in handling the computers and programming.

Swimming Pool: Carmel Aquatic Complex is a brand new swimming pool that facilitate students to learn swimming from their young age. Admission and Withdrawal

- 1. The academic year begins in June.
- 2. Admissions are made strictly on the basis of merit after conducting entrance test and interview of the candidate.
- 3. A candidate who seeks admission has to submit the application form properly filled in.
 - A copy of the marklist of the present academic year must be submitted along with the application form.
- 4. At the time of admission the following particulars are to be furnished in original
 - $a.\,Transfer\,Certificate\,countersigned\,by\,a\,proper\,authority.$
 - b. Conduct Certificate
 - c. Birth Certificate and Community Certificate.
 - d. Mark record
- 5. The school authorities have the right to refuse admission without assigning the reasons.

Admission to Plus One

A student who has passed the AISSE/ICSE/SSLC or an equivalent examination, in English Medium, with marks as (prescribed here under is eligible for Admission to Class XI.

Admission will strictly depend on the availability of seats, as per the merit list, after personal interview.

Students of CARMEL SCHOOL need to submit only their Mark Statement. CBSE students will also have to submit Certificate of School Based Evaluation.

Detention : Students whose overall performance at Unit Tests, Terminal Examination and Annual Examination of Class XI is not satisfactory will not be promoted to Class XII. Students, who do not show satisfactory progress in their academic performance in Class XII and whose conduct is not satisfactory, will not be allowed to appear for the Board Examination. A student who fails in class XI for two consecutive years will be issued with Transfer Certificate. If the performance of the students is not satisfactory one more year will be provided for the improvement

WITHDRAWAL OF TC

- 1. Application for a Transfer Certificate (TC) should be submitted to the Principal in writing. A week's notice is required, and a fee of Rs. 100/- must be paid.
- 2. Those who intend to take a TC at the end of the academic year must apply for it before 31st March. Otherwise, you will have to pay the full fee for the next academic year, after which the TC will be issued.

SCHOOL ETHICAL CODE

- 1. Self-discipline is the forte of the school.
- 2. Every student must carry the Almanac to school every day and use it productively.
- 3. All students are given an Identity card at the beginning of the session. This ID card must be worn to school every day for the identification and security of the child.
- 4. Students should be neatly dressed. The school uniform is to be worn on every working day.
- 5. Students are expected to carry books and notebooks as per the timetable; unnecessary material to school should not be brought.
- 6. Students should be habitually clean. Students who are not in proper uniform will not be allowed to enter their classrooms.
- 7. Students are encouraged to celebrate their birthdays by bringing saplings or contributing books to the school library, rather than bringing chocolates.
- 8. Students are not allowed to bring sharp instruments (like cutters etc.) or valuables to the school.
- 9. The school is committed to protecting the environment and its students to be environment-friendly in all their actions. The use of polybags (plastic bags) is, therefore, strictly prohibited and students should consciously avoid its use for any purpose.
- 10. Students are not allowed to organize any outside premises by endorsing the name of the school.
- 11. In the interest of their security, students are advised not to buy or receive any articles, gifts, or foodstuff from anyone en route.
- 12. It is mandatory for all students to be present for their respective school functions.
- 13. Students are expected to respect school property. No student should damage any school furniture, write or draw anything on the walls irregularly, or in any way damage things belonging to others. Any school property damaged even by accident should be reported at once to the class teacher or the Head of the school.

- 14. Silence must be observed in the corridors and on the stairs during class hours.
- 15. Extreme cleanliness must be observed on the school premises.
- 16. Students are always expected to set standards of good conduct and courtesy in the school, in the buses, and in public places. The school is judged by the conduct of the students.
- 17. Speaking in English is compulsory within the school, on the school bus, and while waiting at the bus stop to board the bus. Every student shall venture to make the school proud by excelling in studies and showcasing good manners.

Strict Disciplinary Action will be taken in case of violation of any of the following rules by students.

- 1. Damaging or disfiguring any school property.
- 2. Bringing any publication reference books, electronic items, including mobile phones, cameras, I-pods, tablets, smartwatches and secondary storage devices (CDS, DVDS, drives, portable HDD, micro-SD or SD cards, etc.), not relevant to academic pursuits.
- 3. Lending or borrowing of money or other articles.
- 4. Bullying and the use of foul language is a punishable offence, whether in or out of school.
- 5. Exploding crackers or splashing colours during Diwali/Holi or any other occasion on the school premises or school buses is strictly forbidden. Students should attend festivals and functions celebrated in the school.

Late Arrival in School

- 1. Students are expected to reach school 10 minutes before the start of school.
- 2. Students arriving late will not be allowed to enter the school premises without a valid explanation.
- 3. The school expects the students to be punctual. Three consecutive late arrivals would lead to the student being sent back home.

Absence from school

- Absence from school for more than 5 consecutive days is not allowed, except on medical grounds, subject to information being provided beforehand via the application. A Medical Certificate and Prescription (photocopies) should be submitted to the class teacher on joining back.
- 2. Absence without leave or unexplained absence for more than five consecutive days renders the student liable to have his / her name struck off the rolls.
- 3. Students must have at least 75% attendance in each term to be eligible to take the assessment/ examination.
- 4. Students availing leave should send the leave application to the school's official email ID.

Library Rules

- 1. All students and staff of the school are members of the library.
- 2. Treat and use the library as a shared resource.
- 3. Follow the code of conduct in the library and maintain silence.
- 4. A student can borrow only one book at a time for one week.
- 5. Books will be issued to the students, during the library periods. No book will be issued or returned during the teaching hours.
- 6. Marking, underlining, or writing on library books is strictly forbidden.
- 7. After reading, make sure that the books, periodicals, and newspapers are kept back at their respective places.
- 8. Reference books and current periodicals will not be issued to any student. These can be read only in the library room.
- 9. If the books are not returned within a specified time, they will be viewed seriously, and fines will be charged as per the rules.
- 10. In case of book is misused, wrongly handled, or lost the person concerned will have to replace the book or pay the full price of the book.
- 11. A 'No Due Certificate' by each student is to be obtained from the librarian.

Recommendations To Parents:

- Without the help and cooperation of parents and guardians it is not possible to build a child's character and develop his/her personality. Therefore, the parents are requested to ensure that the child is strictly following the rules of the school.
- Parents should ensure that their children leave home in time to be punctual in school, wear neat and full uniforms, complete the work given to them, and participate in co-curricular activities.
- 3. Parents should check and sign the progress reports. Parents should refer to the child's calendar (Almanac)daily and sign if any remark is given.
- 4. Parents must develop the habit of meeting the teachers once a month with prior permission.
- 5. Parents/Guardians or any other person are not allowed to see
 the students or communicate with the teachers during school
 hours without the Principal's permission.
- 6. The parents/guardians should kindly read the rules in this calendar. Attention is especially drawn to the rules regarding attendance, discipline, reports, parental cooperation, and payment of fees. Ignorance shall not be an excuse for any lapse.
- 7. Parents or their duly authorized nominee/s have to produce the parent's copy of the identity card to pick up the student from school campus and from the bus stop.
- 8. Parents/guardians are requested to check the school almanac of their ward daily and note the instructions / Remarks made in it. It should be seen and countersigned by parents daily as proof that remarks have been read. Failure to do so may defeat the purpose of the remarks.
- 9. Please address all communication to the principal through the class teacher. Clearly mention your wards name, admission number, class, and section in your communication.
- **School Infirmary:** The school's infirmary is manned by qualified nursing staff. It provides comfort and care to the sick and for minor injury cases. Regular medical checkups will be conducted for the children

Uniform

On all working days, the following school uniform pattern should be followed

- 1. Special Uniform on All Thursdays.
- 2. (a) KG Section: Girls Green pinafore with cream coloured shirt.

 Boys Green shorts with cream coloured shirt.
 - (b) I V: Girls Red checked pinafore with Pink half sleeve shirt.

 Bovs Black shorts with Red checked half sleeve shirt.
 - (c) VI X : Girls –Pink full sleeve shirt with Red checked half skirt and sleeveless blazer.

Boys – Red checked half sleeve shirt with black pants.

- (d) XI -XII : Girls Brick-red colouredChudidar top with Cream coloured pants and sleeveless blazer.
- Boys Brick-red coloured half sleeve shirt with cream colored pants.
- 3. For classes upto V std., only shorts are allowed and Pants are compulsory for boys from VI std.
- 4. Belt with school emblem.
- 5. Tie
- 6. Black shoes and black socks with pink stripes. During rainy season, shoes or black strapped chappal.
- 7. Wearing Low waist skin fit pants is not allowed in school campus.
- 8. Girls skirts should reach below the knee.
- 9. Boys should get their hair regularly trimmed and are not allowed to have board.
- 10. Girls may get their hair middle parted into two pleats.

The school uniform is compulsory on all school days and at official School functions unless otherwise intimated.

Students without the prescribed uniform are not allowed to enter the classroom or the school premises during class hours. They are liable to be sent home. It is the duty of the parents to see that their child does not go to school without proper uniform.

- * To raise funds for the specific purpose of school's welfare.

Parent Teacher Meet

- 1. A regular Parent Teacher interaction is very important for the systematic follow-up of the child.
- 2. Parents can meet the teachers to discuss the child's performance in the school on Fridays from 3.45 pm to 4.30 pm
- 3. The special Parent-Teacher meeting on the Open House is of utmost importance and mandatory.

Assessments Schedule

- 1. Mid Term Tests and Term Tests are obligatory Requests for retests will not be considered.
- 2. Answer papers of all examinations, except that of the annual, will be shown to the parents.
- 3. Progress cards will be issued after each evaluation.
- General proficiency certificates are awarded to the pupils on the merit basis.

As it is necessary to pay an additional amount for these classes, the parents should grant their consent in a written form in the school office, However, once they joined in the class, after a period of trial classes, then they are not allowed to discontinue from it in the present academic year.
